PRIMARY

- Early Voting Starts: May 15, 2024

GENERAL

- Early Voting Starts: October 16, 2024
- Voter Registration Deadline: October 21, 2024
- Last Day to Request Absentee Ballot: October 21, 2024 (by 5 PM)
- Election Day: November 5, 2024 (mailed absentee ballots must be received by 8:00 PM)

What is a pre-registered voter?

This means a voter is registered, prior to voting, at the address in which they live. This avoids hurdles when voting.

There are 3 ways to vote in Iowa. Choose one.






Vote by mail Early in-person Election day





Vote By Mail

The technical term for this method is absentee voting. It's EASY, CONVENIENT, AND FREE! Vote from the comfort of your own home. Simply make a request from your auditor using the absentee ballot request form. Once you make the request, your County Auditor will send a ballot to your home. Once you receive it, vote and put the envelope back in the mail.

Voting in Iowa



Between October 16 and November 5, you can vote at your County Auditor's Office, during business hours. Your poll worker will ask for an ID. The accepted forms of ID are:

- Iowa Voter Identification Card (must be signed)
- Iowa Driver's License (not expired more than 90 days)
- Iowa Non-Operator ID (not expired more than 90 days)
- U.S. Military ID or Veteran ID (must be current)
- U.S. Passport (must be current)
- Tribal ID Card/Document (must be signed, with photo, not expired)

If you DO NOT have the listed documents above, you have 2 MORE options:

- 1. Prove you live where you are registered:
 - Bank Statement
 - Government check or other government document
 - Paycheck
 - Residential lease
 - Property tax statement



2. Ask a registered voter in your precinct to attest (vouch) for you. You and your attester will be asked to sign an oath swearing that you are who you say you are.

Election Day is November 5. Polls are open from 7 AM to 8 PM. Poll workers are required to ask for an ID. If you are not a pre-registered voter, follow the guidelines above. You CAN register on election day.

Voter ID Reminder

Iowa Requires an ID to vote. Acceptable forms are:

- Iowa Voter Identification Card (must be signed)
- lowa Driver's License (not expired more than 90 days)
- Iowa Non-Operator ID (not expired more than 90 days)
- U.S. Military ID or Veteran ID (must be current)
- U.S. Passport (must be current)
- Tribal ID Card/Document (must be signed, with photo, not expired)
